### **Prayer to Saint Dymphna**



Parishes can challenge those assumptions by accepting and reaching out to people with serious and persistent mental illness as well as their families – to open doors and minds to the gifts of all God's people. An essential part of recovery from illnesses is spiritual healing. When faith communities welcome and embrace all God's people, they too are healed and enriched.

Brother Chris has been in the nursing and mental health field since 1984 and feels strongly that spiritual health is missing in today's care of the mentally ill. We all have seen what a difference God makes in our lives, and what a difference being accepted by a community makes in the healing process. It confirms God is an essential part of who we are and a critical part of our being whole.
